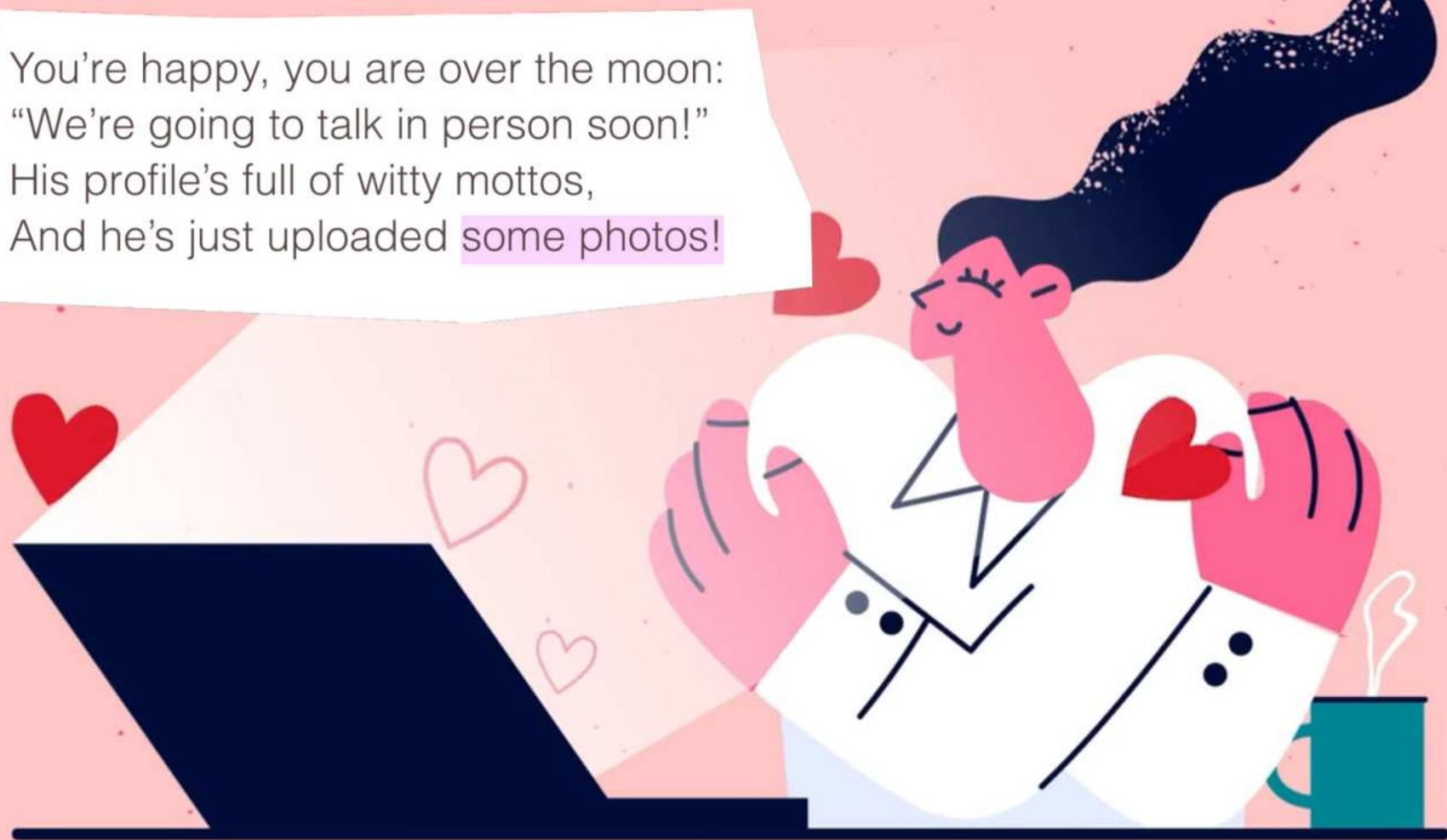
# 21st Century Love

They're from the guy whom you want to meet!



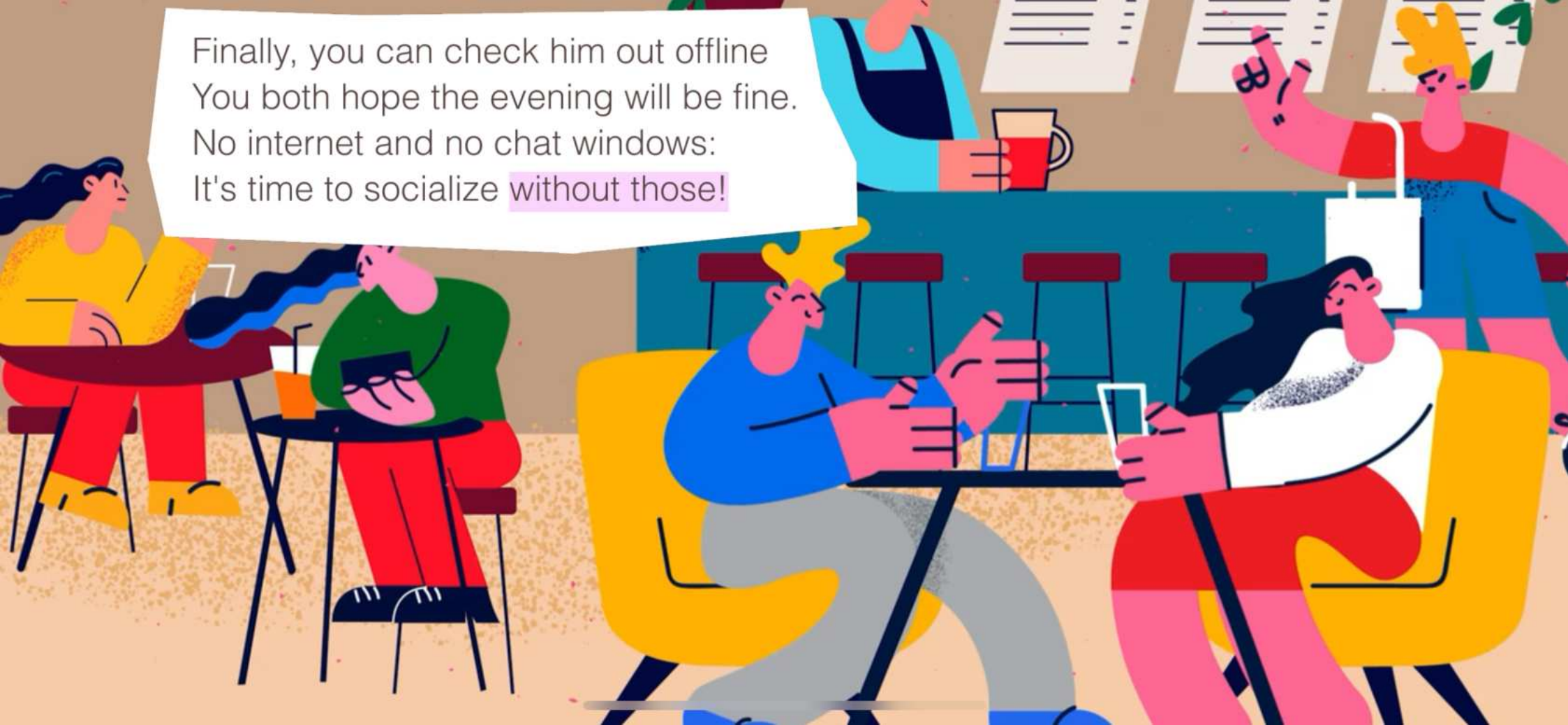
You're happy, you are over the moon:

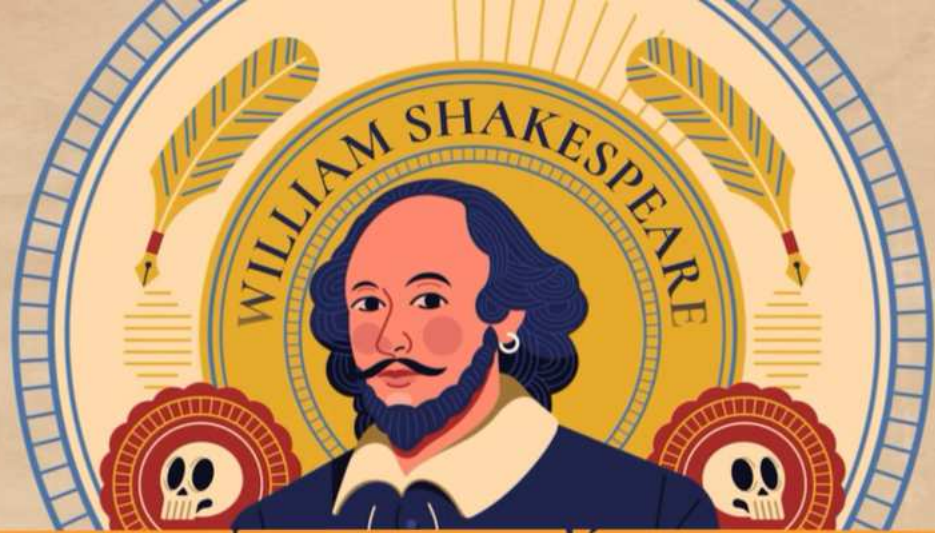

He wrote one hundred and fifty-four sonnets and thirty-eight plays. That's a lot! This is how he spent his golden days.

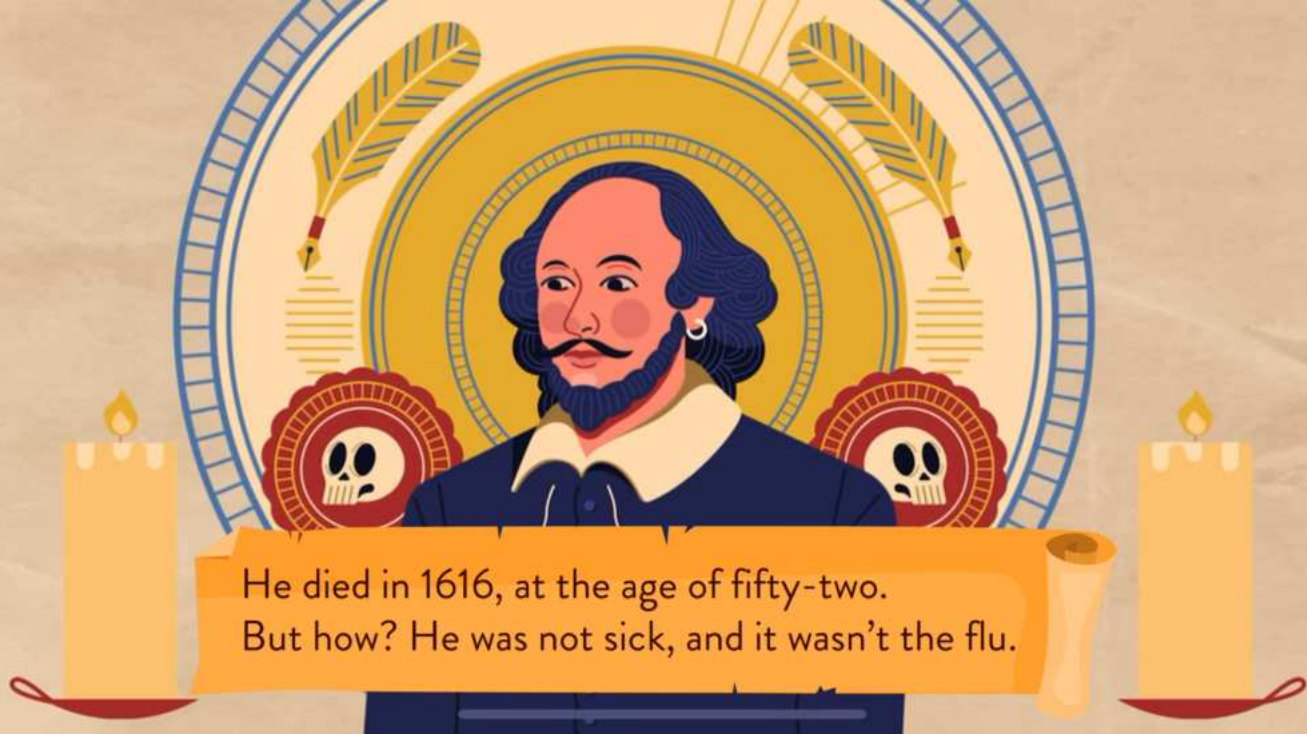


He wrote tragedies like Othello, Macbeth and King Lear,  
And tragicomedies like The Tempest at the end of his career.


He invented one thousand and seven hundred new words, people say.


